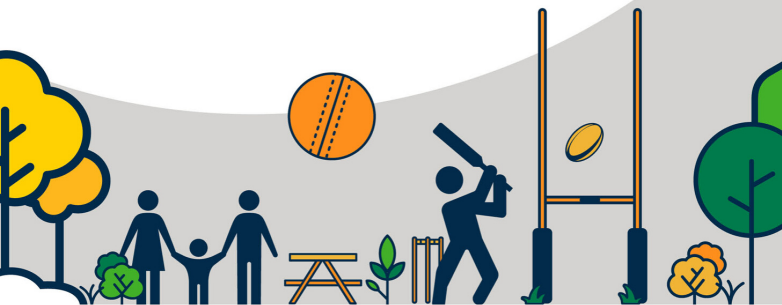


Belmore Park

Stage 1 Community Engagement



From Monday 16 March to Sunday 12 April 2020, the City of Parramatta Council sought feedback from the community on the Landscape Concept Plan developed for Belmore Park (including Richie Benaud Oval) in North Parramatta. Council is in the early stages of developing a Landscape Masterplan for Belmore Park and this was one of the first steps taken in better understanding community needs and wants for the park.

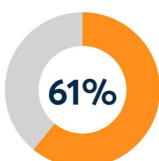

selected **CRICKET NETS FOR PUBLIC USE**



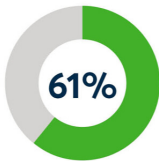
(86 respondents)
