



Council asked the community what they thought about the Draft Local Strategic Planning Statement (LSPS) and Draft Local Housing Strategy (LHS). The LSPS provides a vision and strategic direction to ensure the city is well-planned, liveable, productive and sustainable into the future. The LHS provides direction on where and when future housing growth will be delivered to cater for the needs of Parramatta's diverse community.

Almost half a million people were presented with the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft LSPS and LHS using a number of different engagement channels, including social media, local newspapers and Drop-In Information Sessions.
