Council, in partnership with the NSW Government, is working to transform the heart of Parramatta with our Civic Link.

When completed, Civic Link will be a green and activated pedestrian spine running from Parramatta Square to the Parramatta River. Civic Link will be the piece of the puzzle connecting Parramatta Square's railway and light rail, the future Sydney Metrowest, and the Powerhouse Parramatta Museum at the river's edge. It will be a place that invites our local residents and visitors to shop, sit, gather and move through.

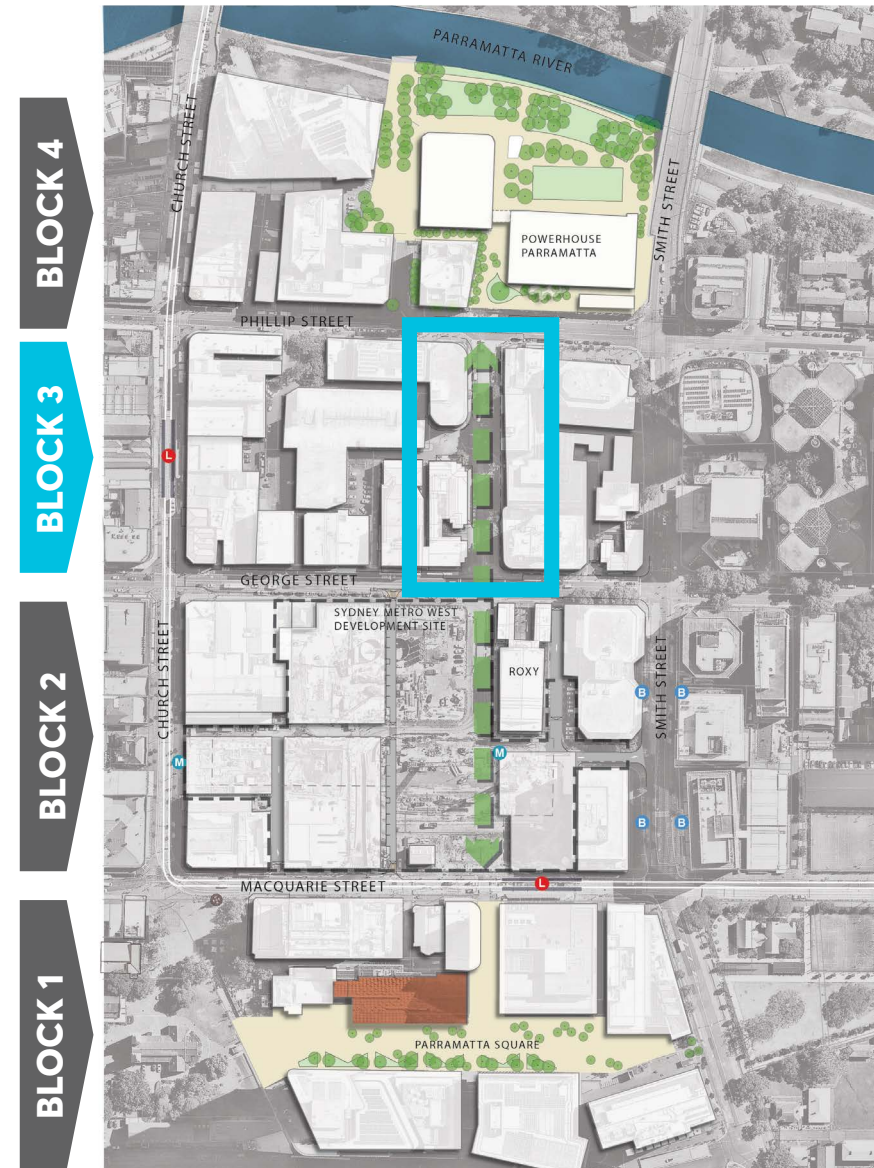
This transformational project is being delivered in four phases – one phase for each block:

Delivered by Council

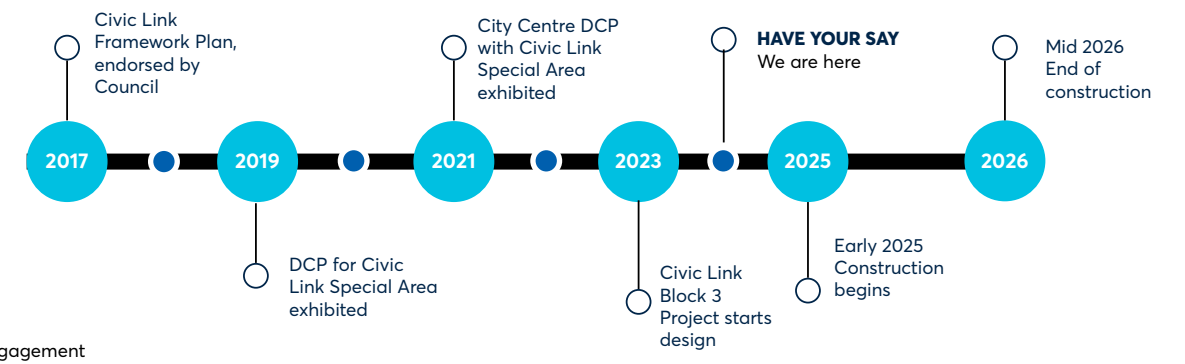
Block 2: Sydney Metro West

Civic Link Block 3

This project will transform an existing street, Horwood Place, into a high-quality pedestrian way and public space. New intersection treatments at George and Phillip Streets will improve intersection function and facilitate safe crossing. Social settings

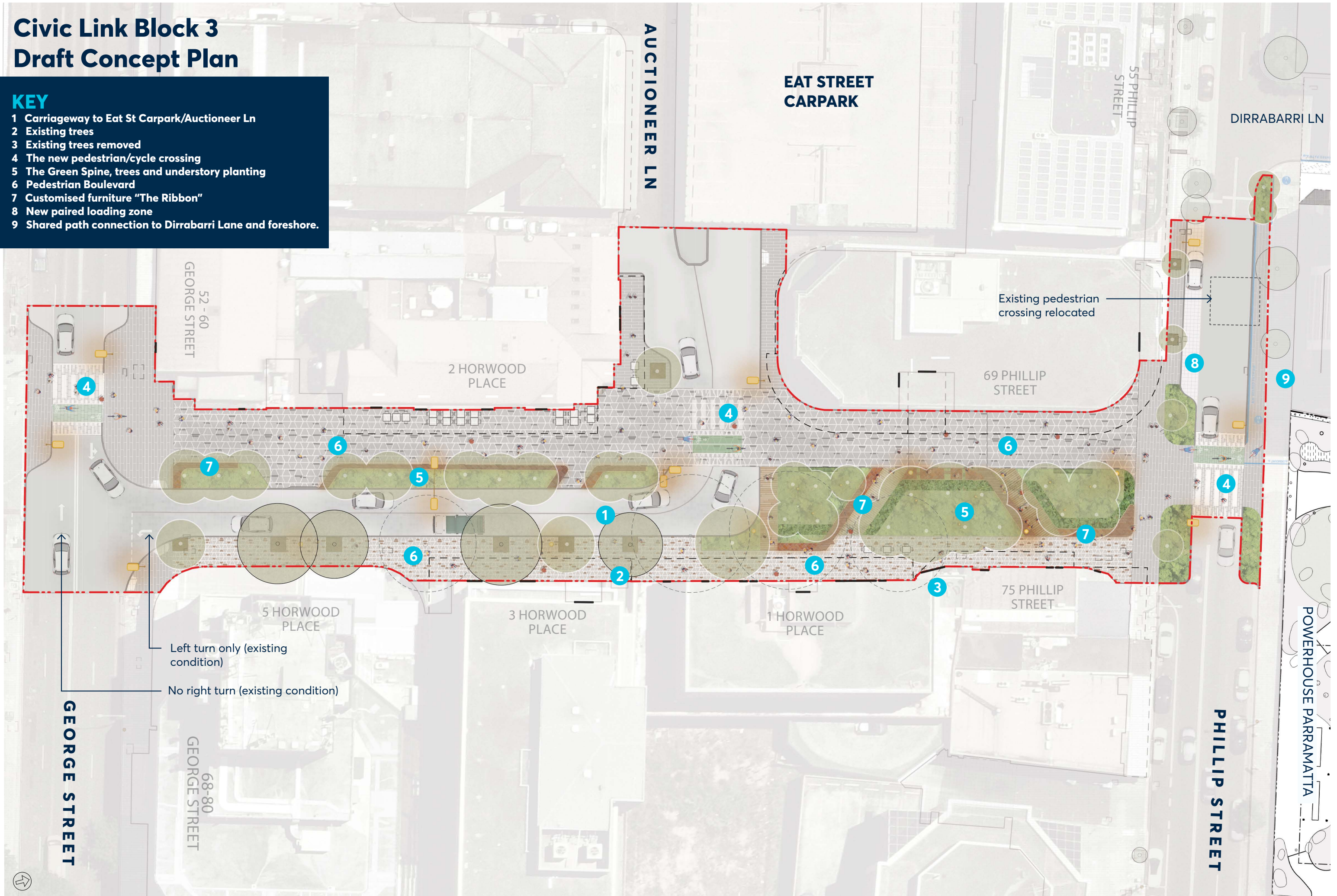
within the public domain will invite occupation, host outdoor dining, cultural events and displays. The project will integrate continued vehicular access to the Erby Place (Eat Street) Car Park and adjacent properties in a traffic-calmed, slow

speed environment. The project continues the transformation of the city centre to a green and walkable place; connects key transport hubs with destinations in the CBD and creates a new premium address within the city.

- 9 Shared path connection to Dirrabarri Lane and foreshore.



Civic Link Block 3 Key Design Features

The Green Spine: A green canopy from mature trees, and lush shrubs and ground covers will create a vibrant frame as people journey through.



Pedestrian Boulevard: Widened paths to accommodate anticipated increases in foot traffic and ensure access for emergency service vehicles. The design also incorporates smart lighting and CCTV along with dynamic and static wayfinding.



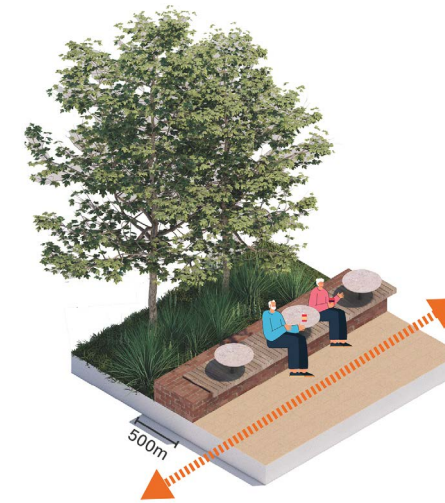
The Water Story: A design feature that directs and harvests local run off to treatment areas in the embedded gardens to improve water quality and move water down to the River



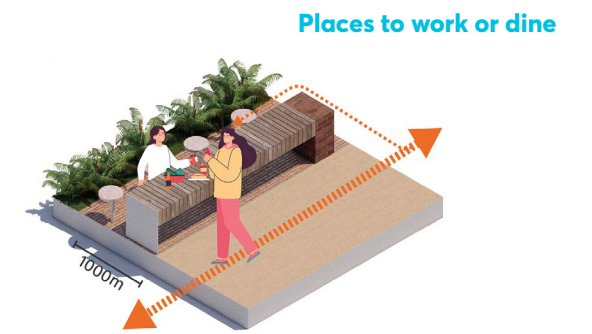
The Ribbon: Customised street furniture threading through the green spine, changing along the path to create diverse seating options.



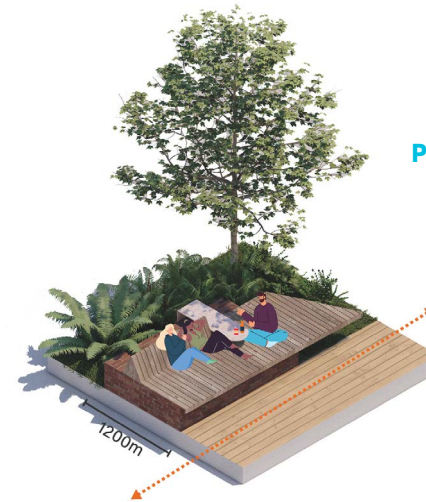
Civic Link Block 3 will have a wide range of outdoor seating options suitable for all ages, ensuring everyone can find a comfortable place to spend time in the city.
