1.1 PROJECT BACKGROUND: SITE CONSTRAINTS

LEGEND

(IN ROAD

- 1 Sloped embankments on either side of TfNSW restrict pedestrian movement between parks
- 2 Existing drainage/electrical infrastructure must be retained and restricts potential uses
- 3 Interface with residential properties must be considered to reduce noise/visual pollution
- (4) Sloped topography restricts potential uses and make accessible pathways more difficult
- 5 Significant existing trees must be retained and considered in the design
- 6 Busy major roadways require fencing for safety
- (7) Narrow property requires careful design and planning to maximise use
- 8 Existing flood conditions must be considered and where possible improved



1.3 SUGGESTED SPATIAL ARRANGEMENT PLAN



LEGEND

- 1 Provide safe separated pedestrian/cycle links from adjacent development (263-281 Pennant Hills Road)
- (2) Provide accessible shared paths connections
- ③ Upgrade and expand existing cricket facilities
- (4) Utilise flatter land for children's playground facilities (Ages 5-12)
- (5) Utilise flatter land for recreational & social sports facilities
- 6 Utilise and upgrade existing facilities to improve social infrastructure
- Provide fitness stations for various age groups along pathways
- 8 Utilise narrow parcel unsuitable for social & active recreation for a new community dog park
- Improve canopy cover and create buffers to residential properties
